One of our Matriarchs is רְחֵל (Rachel) whom the גְמָרָא praises for her exceptional modesty and sensitivity toward the feelings of others.


When our forefather, יַאֲקֹב (Jacob) asked רַחֵל to marry him, she answered,

זאָסְאָּ's (Esther) Real Name

In the Book of ב,ז) אֶסְתֵּר, Esther 2,7) we are told "הַדַּסָה הִיא אֶסְתֵּר", "Hadassah is Esther."

Was her real name Hadassah or Esther? רְבָּי מֵאִיר says her real name was actually אֶסְתֵר She was nicknamed הְדַסָּה meaning, "myrtle" since righteous people are called "myrtles" (see גכריה א,ח Zech. 1,8).

רְבִּי יְהוּדָה says she was really הֲדַסָּה and was called הֶקַדַסָּת from the word "הֶסְתֵּר" or "hidden" since she would hide the fact she was Jewish.

רָבִּי נְחֶמְיָה says הֲדַשָּה was her name and she was called אֶסְתַּרַ" from the word "אָסְתַּרַ"

which means "moon" in Aramaic, as if to say she was as beautiful as the moon. בָּן עַזַּאי says that הְהַדַּשָּה since she was neither tall nor short but rather average in height, like a myrtle.

רִבִּי יְהוֹשֵׁע בֶּן קָרְחָה also says her name was אֶסְתֵּר but she was called הַדַּשָּה since she had a greenish face. Hashem, in His

kindness, made her appear beautiful to the nations of the world and to king אַחַשְׁוֵרוֹשָׁ.
