


Inside the Daf

If a man dies without children, the Torah says his widow marries his brother. This marriage is called יְבָמָה (Levirate marriage), the widow is called a יְבָמָה and the brother is called a יְבָמָה.

If a widow is waiting for her יְבָם to perform יְבָום, may the יְבָם revoke her vows?

Our אַבָּמָה quotes יְבָמָה who says that the יָבָם may revoke the אָלִיעָזֶר svows. יְבָמָ understands that יָבוּם is like יִפּוֹאָין (regular, full marriage). Just like a husband may revoke his wife's vows after וָּשׁוּאִין, so too may he revoke the vows at יִבוּם.

יְבָּי שָׁקִיבָּא disagrees. He says a יְבָח may not revoke the vows of a יְבָמְה because יְבָמְה is not like a regular marriage. A regular marriage creates a stronger bond between the husband and wife and so the husband may revoke his wife's vows.



קאָמָר: The Levirate Pre-Marriage

When a man dies childless, his brother performs (חַלִיצָה (or הַלִיצָה) with his brother's widow.

But before he moves in with her to begin living as a husband and wife, the Sages ruled that the יבם must perform a marriage ceremony. This



and is very simple. Two witnesses have to see the יְבָמָה something worth at least a פרוטה (a small coin used in the times of the מִשְׁנַה).

Did You Know...

The great sage, גָּן עַזַאי, once

exclaimed, "Pity on בן עַזַאי who did

not serve [study under] רְבִי עַקִיבָא"

We have learned (see "Inside the Daf") that רבי אַלִיעֵזֶר holds that a יַבָם may revoke a יְבָמָה's vows. The Talmudic sage רָבָּי אַמִי says that this is true even if the יָבָם has only performed מַאֲמָר which is not a full יבום relationship. רַבָּי אֵלִיעֵזַר holds that מאמר is as strong as בום itself.
