As long as a סוּכָּה was built to provide shade (and not, for example, for privacy) the is valid. A סוּכָּה does not even need to be built by someone who is obligated in the סוּכָּה of living in a מִצְנָה!

The גָּבֶּרֶא gives an acronym of גנב"ד which stands for four types of people whose סוּכּוֹת are סוּכּה (valid) even though they are not commanded to live in a סוּכּה.



For example if a non-Jew builds a סוּכָּה to provide shade for himself during the summer.

For example, women used to weave clothing in shaded outdoor huts to keep cool.



Animal – בְּהֵמָה



Did You Know...

A סוּכָּה built to give shade to animals is בָּשֵׁר for fulfilling the סוּכָּה (commandment) of סוּכָּה.

This is an ancient group of converts who converted to Judaism out of fear. They were later found to be worshipping idols.





A circular פָשֵר can be יָפֶשר (valid). As long as a square 7 (valid). As long as a square 7 (about 24.5 in, or 63 cm) by 7 יְפָחִים can fit inside the circle. This is because the minimum size a יְפָחִים may be is 7X7 יְפָחִים.

Different Booths

Even structures that are made to be moved from place to place may be valid סוכות, so long as they were built to provide shade. The נְמָרָא gives four examples of these structures which can be remembered by the acronym רקב"ש. The letters stand for the huts of the following people:

רועים - Shepherds



Shepherds watching flocks of animals would sit in huts to protect themselves from the sun.

בוּרְגָנִין - City Watchmen



These people would sit in temporary booths while performing their duty.

- קיִיצִים - Fig Watchers



People who watch over figs spread in the field to dry would have huts to provide them with shade.

Produce Watchers - שוּמְרֵי פֵירוֹת



Guards who would watch over the produce of fields would sit in small huts. Since the produce would be eventually taken in

from the field, these huts were temporary.
