


Inside the Daf

The בִית הַמִּקְדָשׁ who served in the בִית הַמִּקְדָשׁ (Holy Temple) were divided into groups according to their families. One of these groups was the בִּילְגָה family.

The reason for this punishment centered around מִרְיָם בַּת בִּילְגָה, a member of the בִּילְגָה family. Before the Greeks entered the Temple Sanctuary she converted out of the Jewish faith and married a Greek officer.



To make matters worse, when the Greeks entered the Temple Sanctuary she kicked the Altar and called it a wolf that eats up the money of the Jewish people and does not help them in a time of need.

Some say the reason the Sages punished the בִּילְגָה family group is because they were once late coming to the Temple for duty. This showed that the Temple service wasn't important to them.

The אָמָרָא asks why the whole family group of בִּילְגָה should be punished on

account of something one person (מְרְיָם) did! The answer is that anyone who shows such disrespect for the Temple as מְרְיָם did surely learned it from her parents.

But still, the גְמָרָא continues, why punish the *entire* family group? Punish only her parents! The גְמָרָא explains the entire group is punished because anyone who is in the company of the wicked can expect punishment to befall him.

Fortunately, the opposite is also true: Anyone who keeps in the company of the righteous can expect reward!

On the holiday of סוכות, we are required to say two special blessings at the beginning of the holiday: "שֶׁהֶחֵיַנוּ" ("to sit in the booth") and "שֶׁהֶחֵיַנוּ" ("that He gave us life").

According to לֵישֶׁב בַּסְכָה" blessing first because it discusses the requirement to sit in a סוכה which is the special obligation of the holiday.

since we "שהחינו" since we first say "שהחינו" recite that blessing on every holiday. We have a rule that "תַּדִיר קוֹדָם", if we have two things to do and one is more common than the other, we do the more common thing first. In our case we have two blessings to recite but since the "שֶׁהְחֵינוּ" blessing is more common, because it is said on all holidays, we say it before the blessing over sitting in the סוּכַה.

The אָמָרָא rules that we follow the opinion of רָב.
