The מִשְׁנַה teaches that on יוֹם כְּפוּר, the כַּהָן גַּדוֹל had to immerse himself in a מְקוֵה (ritual bath) five times and wash his hands with his feet ten times.

Since one is not allowed to enter the עַזַרָה (Temple Courtyard) without first immersing in a מקוה, the first of the five מקוה immersions took

place in the מָקוָה on top of the שַער המים (The Water Gate) which is outside the Courtyard.

Anyone on the bottom level of the as כהן גדול could see the שער הַמַּיִם as he went into the מְקוֵה. To prevent the people from seeing the כהן גדול undressed, a linen sheet would be held up blocking the view from the bottom level.

The last four immersions of the כֹהֶן גַּדוֹל took place in the מְקוֵה on the roof of the בִּית הַפַּרוָה (Parvah Chamber). This was the chamber in the where the hides of עולה offerings were salted. These hides would be given to כֹהַנִים.

Did You Know

רב חסדא says, you may not recite the holy words of the שמע while your hand is in a bathroom, or if you have feces on your body. This is because the פסוק (verse) in לה, י) תהלים (Psalms 35:10) says, "כל". "עַצְמוֹתֵי תֹּאמֶרְנַה ה׳ מִי כַמוֹדָ... "all my bones say: 'G-d who is like You..." All of our bones have to praise Hashem, not just some of them! (Rashi)

Watch-Your-Handsl


It is a מִצְנָה (Commandment) to wash your hands before eating bread.

The גְּמָרָא tells us how important it is to make sure those hands remain clean throughout your meal.

For example, if you go to the bathroom in the middle of the meal, you have to rewash your hands if they touched urine.

Not only that, but if you take a long break in the middle of a meal to speak to a friend you have to wash both your hands before returning to the meal. This is because you were probably not careful to keep your hands clean for that long a period of time.
