A בְּרֵיְתָּא teaches us that everyday Hashem "cries" for three types of people: 1) One who is able to involve himself in Torah study, but does not; 2) One who is not able to involve himself in Torah study, but does so anyway, and; 3) A community leader who behaves haughtily toward his community.

The גְּמָרָא tells a story of someone who spent what little time he had to study Torah.



עב אִידִי used to travel for three months just to spend one day learning Torah at a Rabbinical academy. Some rabbis used to mock him and call him "a student for one day." עב אִידִי was very hurt by this comment. Hurting the feelings of a Torah scholar is a very serious sin and can result in Divine punishment.


רָבִּי יוֹחְנֵן, the head of the academy, set out to educate the rabbis who insulted בב אִידִי about the value of even one day of Torah study.

"If someone has only one day a year to occupy himself in Torah study," said רַבִּי יוֹחָנֶן,
"Hashem considers it as though he has studied Torah for the entire year!"

Then רַבִּי יוֹחָנֵן warned the rabbis, "And anyone who sins for only one day a year, Hashem considers it as if he has sinned for the entire year!"







Dying Young

One day the great sage, רֶבִּי יוֹחָנֵן, went on a journey. He saw a man gathering figs who was leaving behind the ripe ones and taking the unripe ones.

Curious about this, רָבִי יוֹחָנֶן asked the man, "Aren't the ripe ones better?"

"I need these figs for food for a journey,-" explained the man. "The unripe ones will keep for the journey. The ripe ones, however, will spoil before my journey is over."

From this רְבִּי יוֹחָנֵן learned a parable. Just like unripe figs are taken for food on a journey because they will not spoil, so too, some people die when they are young so that they will not be spoiled by sin in their lifetime.

The גמָרא remarks that sometimes people die when they are young because of a major sin they

committed. For example, there was a young student in ירבי אַלֶּכְּסַנְדְּרִי's neighborhood who died early because he was rebellious against his teachers, not treating them with proper respect!
