



Inside the Daf

The Torah says, "וְנִקְדַּשְׁתִּי בְּתוֹךְ בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל", "I will be made holy among the Children of Israel" (ויקרא כב,לב), Lev. 22,32). From this the גמרא teaches that anything when a "דַבר שָבְקדוּשָה", a "matter of holiness" is being performed, ten men must be present. Here are some examples of a "דַבר שֶבְקדוּשָׁה":

Activities that require a pap (ten men)



עוֹבְרִין לִפְנֵי הַתֵּיבָה. Passing Before the Ark. The עמידה prayer is not repeated by the וזה (prayer leader) unless ten men are present.



נושאין את כפּיהַם. Raising their Hands. The כהנים must raise their hands when they bless the Jewish people. A וֹמְנַיַן is needed for this.



קוֹרין בּתּוֹרה. Reading the **Torah.** When the Torah is read in public, ten men must be present for the Torah reading to count.



מַפּטִירִין בַּנַבִיא. Ending with the Prophets. When the הפטרה (section from the Prophets) is read in public, a מְנֵין must be present.



בּרְכַּת חֲתַנִים. Blessing for Grooms.

The seven blessings recited over wine under the wedding canopy, and after meals during the first week of marriage, may only be said if a מנין is present.



מַזמְנין בּשָׁם. Inviting with Hashem's Name. If ten (or more) men eat a meal together, Hashem's Name mentioned in the invitation for ברכת המזון (Grace After Meals).

Did You Know...


The prophet אָכַרְיָה (Zachariah) had another name, מְשֵׁלֶם. The name comes from the root ש.ל.ם meaning "complete." יבריָה was called by this name because he was "complete" in his service to Hashem (he was righteous).



Torah-Readers

When the Torah is read publicly, the reading is split up into a number of sections called עֵלִיוֹת. Nowadays, before each of these sections is read, a man goes up to the Torah and recites a blessing. It used to be that the man would also read the section from the Torah.





So how many sections is a Torah reading divided into? The גְּמֶרָא says that the Monday, Thursday and Sabbath afternoon Torah readings are divided into three sections. יוֹם טוֹב (Festival) readings have five sections and the Sabbath morning Torah reading is divided into seven sections.

Moment בות A Moment

"I'm so ashamed!" said Meshulem. "The other day I was in a store with some friends and we were talking really loudly. The owner of the store came up to us and said, I thought you religious boys would behave better.' I'm so embarrassed I made religious Jews look bad."

"Well," said Meshullem's friend, "there is something you can do to fix that."

"What's that?" asked Meshullem.

"You can make a קדוש 'קדוש in public, something that makes lewish people look good. Today's daf yomi quotes the verse, 'I will make Myself holy among the Children of Israel.' Hashem is 'made holy' when we act righteously in public. Not only that, but it can cure any חלול הי, desecration of Hashem's Name, that you may have done by making Jews look bad!"

(רבינו בחיי, ויקרא כב,לב)

Why should the readings be divided into three, five or seven sections? One answer is that the בַּרְכַּת כֹּהֲנִים (Priestly Blessing) has three verses, one with three words, one with five and one with seven verses.

Another answer is that the numbers three, five and seven are the numbers of royal helpers mentioned in different places in תַּנִייך (Bible). For example, there were three guards in the בִּית הַמִּקְדָּשׁ (Holy Temple) who looked after all the Temple's needs, five close companions of the king who sat with him constantly (מלכים בי כה,יח-יט, II Kings 25,18-19), and seven close advisers to the king in מְגְלַת אֶסְתֵּר (אַ, יִד) מְּגְלַת אֶסְתֵּר (אַר, יד).
