We have learned the rule, "אָאָין מְעָרְבִין שִׂמְחָה בְּשִׂמְחָה" "we do not mix two types of joy" (see pg. 37). Because of this rule we may not have a wedding on חול הַמוֹעֵד. But what is the source that we do not "mix" two types of joy together?

The גְמָרָא says that this rule is learned from שְׁלמֹה (King Solomon).

After King Solomon built the first בֵּית הַמִקְדָּשׁ (Holy Temple), he held a celebration. This celebration was held for seven days before the תוכות (Festival of Booths) holiday. If one were allowed to "mix" together two occasions of joy, why didn't שָׁלְמָה schedule the celebration for the first Temple at the same time as the תוכות holiday? It must be that we

may not mix together two occasions of joy.



tells us גְמָרָא that when King Solomon wanted to bring the ארון (Holy Ark) קדש into the בית המקדש, the gates would not open. sand 24 שלמה songs of prayer, still but the doors would not open. He even asked the gates

to open, but they wouldn't. Finally, the king asked Hashem to remember King David, שְׁלֹמֹה's father. At that, the gates opened and the faces of King David's enemies turned black with humiliation for this showed that Hashem had forgiven him for wrongdoing.
