




The גמרא gives examples from פנייך (Bible) when it was okay to lie – and even encouraged!



Angels arrived to give אַבְרָהָם (Abraham) great news. He and שָׁרָה were going to have a son! When שָׁרָה (Sarah) heard the news, she laughed. How could her husband, at such an old age, father a child? When Hashem reported שְׁרָה disbelief to אַבְרָהָם, He did not quote her as saying, "My husband is so old," but as saying, "I am so old." Hashem did not want שַׁרָהַם to be upset with

n any way over calling him old, so, to keep the peace between them, Hashem changed what שַׂרָה said.



יוֹסֵף's (Joseph's) brothers feared their powerful sibling. After all, they had thrown him into a pit, leaving him for dead and sold him to travelling merchants. After their father יַּעֲלֶב (Jacob) died, the brothers feared יוֹסֵף would take his revenge. So they told him that their father had ordered יוֹסֵף had done no such thing. This way, the brothers could continue to live in peace with יוֹסֵף.



When the prophet שְׁמוּאֵל (Samuel) went to offer a sacrifice and anoint דָּוִד (David) as king, he told King אָאוּל (Saul) only that he was leaving to offer a sacrifice to Hashem. He left out the part about anointing דָּוָד as king because he was afraid it would anger שָׁאוּל so much his life might be endangered!

Who-Must-Multiply?

Only men, not women, are commanded to have children according to the תַּנָא קַמָּא (First Tanna) of the מִשְׁנָה. We see in the Torah that Hashem commanded יַצִּקֹב בּ

(Jacob) to "פְּרֵה וּרְבֵה" "be fruitful and multiply" (בראשית כה, יא). Gen. 25,11). Since Hashem was speaking to יַּצְלְב alone, we see only a man is commanded to have children.

רַבִּי יוֹחָגֶן בֵּן בִּרוֹקָה disagrees. He says that both

men and woman are commanded to have children. We see that Hashem commanded both אָדָם (Adam) and חַנָּה (Eve) to " פַּרנּ

"וּרְבוּ "be fruitful and multiply" (הְבוּי, "be fruitful and multiply", Gen. 1, 28). Since Hashem commanded this of both of them, we see that women, too are commanded to have children.
