




Inside_the_Daf

The marriage of a פֿהֵן נָּדוֹל to a widow is not allowed by the Torah. A בְּרַיְתָּא teaches, that if a פֿהֵן נָדוֹל goes ahead and marries a widow, the Sages punished him by making him pay his wife certain things. For example, if he divorces her he owes her a בְּרוֹבָה payment (100 or 200 זוֹנ) and בִּרוֹבָה, the "fruits" of her property he used while they were married. For example, if his wife brought in an apple tree to the marriage and the husband ate the apples, he now owes her the value of the apples he ate. Look at the graphic, below to learn what else he must pay.




The Grandmother and the Widow

The Grandmother and the Widow

What's the difference between marrying your grandmother and a פֿהֵן גָּדוֹל marrying a widow? The פֿהֵן גָדוֹל says that if a בְּהֵן גָדוֹל says that if a בַּהֵן גָדוֹל marries a widow, he must divorce her but she gets a payment and more (see "Inside the Daf" to learn about everything she

receives). If you marry your grandmother, you must divorce her...and she gets nothing. Why is there a difference?



grandmother married a grandson she does not get her בְּתוּבָה payment. This will discourage her from disobeying the rule of the Sages.



Did You Know...

Only male פֿהַנִּים are not allowed to become טָמֵא (impure) by coming into contact with a dead body. This is because the Torah says that only "the sons of אַהַרֹן (Aaron)" may not become אַהַרֹן, Lev. 21,1). The daughters of אַהָרֹן, however, may come into contact with a dead body.

A אודף Moment

"Can you believe it?" asked Robbie. "Jimmy tripped me at recess but we both got a detention! The teacher said it's because I teased him first. That's not fair! *He* was the one who tripped *me*!"

"That's true," said Robbie's father, "but everyone knows hurting someone is wrong. Less people know that teasing someone is wrong. Someone we have to give a serious punishment for 'crimes' that not everyone knows are wrong. That way, those 'crimes' are taken more seriously."

"I get it," said Robbie. "It's like what we read about in the גְּמֶרֶא. If a grandmother marries her grandson, she loses her בְּתוּבָה because not everyone takes that rule seriously. A widow who marries בְּתוּבָה may keep her בְּתוּבָה because most people take that rule seriously!"
