The gates that lead from the east into the יעָנֶרָה (Court-yard) of the בֵּית (Holy Temple) are called the נִיקָנוֹר Gates. The גְּמֶרָא tells us the miraculous story behind these gates.

"THESE ONES"

A man named ניקנור had gone to Alexandria in Egypt to get doors for the בֵּית הַמִּקְדָשׁ. On his way back to Jerusalem, a storm arose at sea and the sailors threw one of the doors overboard to lighten the ship.

The storm raged on and the ship was still in danger. The sailors took the second door to throw it overboard but ניקנור strapped his body to it.

"Throw me into the sea with it!" גיקנור cried.

Before the sailors had a chance to abide יִנִיקְנוֹר wishes, the storm stopped.

ציקנור was surely relieved, but was pained about the loss of the first door. When he arrived at the port of Acre, he saw the first door coming up from under the sides of the boat! (Others say, a sea monster swallowed it and spat it out on the dry land!)

To commemorate this miracle, when all the gates in the Temple were changed to gold, the copper יִּקְנוֹר gates remained unchanged. Some say: the copper was so bright it shone like gold.

time of the In the Second הַמְקדַש בית (Holy Temple) the אַבִטִינָס family was responsible for making the קטרת (incense) and were the only ones who knew how to prepare it properly. They refused to share this secret with anyone.
