כֹּהֵן גָּדוֹל We learned that it is a good sign if the selects the lottery that says "לֵַּּטם" (for Hashem) with his right hand and not his left.

צְדּוּקִים answered, "No. Don't give the רַבִּי עֲקִקיבָא (Sadducees) a way to be overbearing."

## Did You Know...

There are opinions in the גְּמָרא who hold that if the lottery for the two goats wasn't done, the כֹהּן גָּדוֹל could himself choose which goat will be offered "לֵַּּט" (to Hashem) and which one



רַבִּי explains that רַשִׁ"י עִקִיָָא meant to say, if we allow the כֹהן גָּדוֹל to change the lottery process, the צְדּוּקים will say we allow changes to be made in the Torah when the rules don't work out the way we like. They will say we do as we please without really listening to the Torah. To prevent this claim, רַבִּי insisted the lottery stay in whichever hand it was chosen.


We have learned that of the two goats in the lottery,
 (sin offering.) What about the one chosen "לַעֲזַזאזָּל"?

The Torah tells us that the goat "לַעֲזָאזֵל" had a special purpose: it would atone for the sins of the Jewish people.
