
One day, רַבִּי יִשְׁמַעֵאל בֵּן קִמְחִית was talking to a certain idol worshipper. While they were talking, some spittle from the idolater landed on רָבִּי יִשְׁמֵעֵאל בֵּן 's clothes. The קַמְחִית say an idolater's spittle makes someone טָמֵא (impure) if he touches it. This meant that רָבִּי יִשְׁמֵעֵאל בֶּן קִמְחִית couldn't perform the יום כפור Service. His brother יוסף stepped in in his place to perform the service. Their mother saw two of her sons serve as בֹהַנִים גָּדוֹלִים in one day!

In fact, רָבִּי יִשְׁמֵעֵאל בֵּן קמְחִית was one of seven brothers, all of whom served as a at one time or another! The Sages asked his mother what she had done to merit having such sons. She answered that it was a result of her exceptional modesty.
